JOINT LETTER FROM BOARD PRESIDENT AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Greetings! Thank you all for your supporting the work of PeaceWorks, Inc. Our success is our community's success. In 2019, PeaceWorks made an impact through the crucial services provided by staff and volunteers: PeaceWorks answered 384 crisis hotline calls; provided 2,197 nights of shelter to individuals; and, sheltered 48 pets for a total of 1,272 nights.

PeaceWorks collaborated with several agencies throughout the year to provide 32 outreach events where education, resources and support were offered to our community and surrounding areas. Additionally, our social media presence has had grown substantially helping us spread education and awareness that relationship violence is never okay.

PeaceWorks retains an effective, collaborative team of staff and volunteers who are well trained with specializations and who are compassionate and seek to enjoy their work. PeaceWorks is committed to the development of its staff and volunteers and offer unique and meaningful training opportunities throughout the year which supports our comprehensive services. We have evolved programming, as necessary. No task is to big or small for PeaceWorks' fearless advocates.

In 2019, PeaceWorks developed and continues to maintain organization fiscal sustainability We increased our unrestricted fund giving, individual and community-based donations, and maximal use of appropriate grants. Our three annual events: The Taste of Italy, Spring Tea and the Witches Tea were wonderful events that were well attended and looked forward to by the community.

Our volunteers continue to be devoted to our cause, without whom we could not do what we do. In 2019, we had 31 volunteers provide 9,580 hours of service, helping us move forward to help clients during their journey, including our crisis line, fundraising efforts, administrative assistance, and aid around the shelter (clean up, and organization).

PeaceWorks' Board of Directors is strong with eight members, each devoted to the cause, and ready to assist in the success of the program. Our Board brings a diversity of experience, including an attorney, a Park County Sheriff's Office Victim Advocate, male and female small business owners and a trauma therapist. The Board and Executive Director work well together to provide the best possible services to our clients and community.

We are passionately committed to continuing to provide victims of violence safety and the first steps to healing, in which we have done since 1986. As a Service Organization, it is imperative we are visibly championing our cause to the community and the people we serve. We thank you for your dedication and support, particularly during these times when so many are in need.

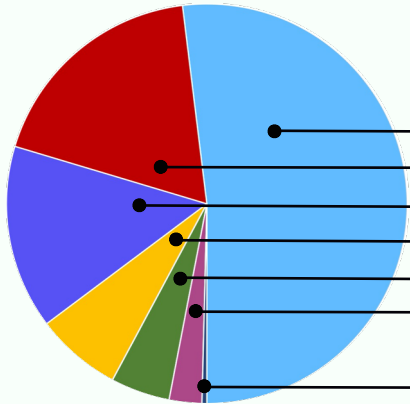

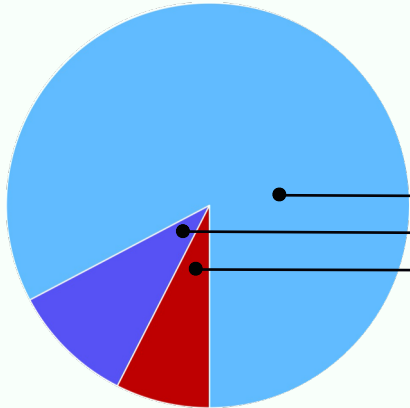
Statement of Finances as of December 31, 2019

What a difference a year makes! PeaceWorks, Inc made great strides during 2019 towards improving the organization's financial stability. The line of credit was paid off, grant funding increased, and staff worked diligently and creatively to manage the ever-changing demands on the limited budget. The auditors summarized it best when they reported that at the end of 2019 'the total available (cash and receivables) is \$144,525 which would cover 5.8 months of general expenditures'.

COVID-19 has resulted in the cancellation of some of the fundraisers scheduled for 2020. PeaceWorks, Inc staff and Board are exploring social media fundraising opportunities to offset the loss of some of our traditional fundraising opportunities. We thank you for your past generosity and request your continuing support as we maneuver these unsettled times.
