## Joint Letter from Board President and Executive Director

2018 was full of growth and change. We welcomed new staff and new Board members, expanded our programming and services through increased advocacy and outreach: expanding victims services to include sex assault not related to intimate partner violence/domestic violence and sex trafficking. In 2018 we have built partnerships that will have a lasting and positive impact for our community. We have been consistently growing and learning through our involvement with other community and system-based organizations, ongoing trainings and education.

Our continuing goal is to keep our overhead low while increasing our service in the field, and you truly make this possible! PeaceWorks is stronger than ever due to our continually increasing support from the community-coming together to donate time, resources, and talent in support of our important mission. In 2018, 87 individuals received 2,203 nights of shelter; advocates answered 384 crisis hotline calls and sheltered 56 pets for 1,176 nights. We could not do what we do without our dedicated volunteers who logged 9,711 hours!

Every day we see the success in those we serve, the resilience to rise above, gaining ability, mindset, fortitude, and power to make the necessary decisions to regain autonomy and self-sufficiency. A survivor picking up the phone to make that first call for support speaks volumes for their fortitude and bravery for making the initial steps to personal safety and empowerment. Thank you for wholeheartedly for being a part of the movement to end domestic violence in our community. Our success is the community's success. With the ongoing support of our donors, partners, Board and volunteers, PeaceWorks is ready for the challenges and achievements ahead in 2019-2020.

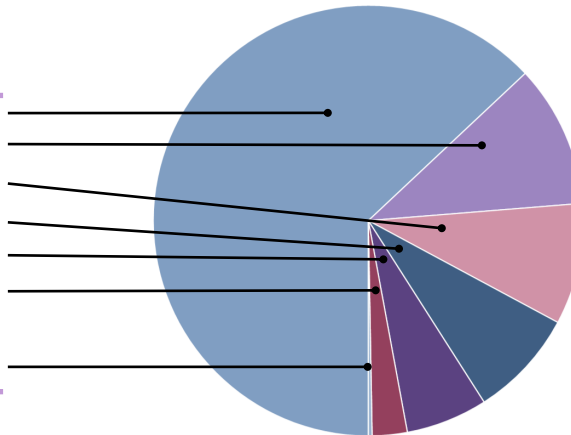

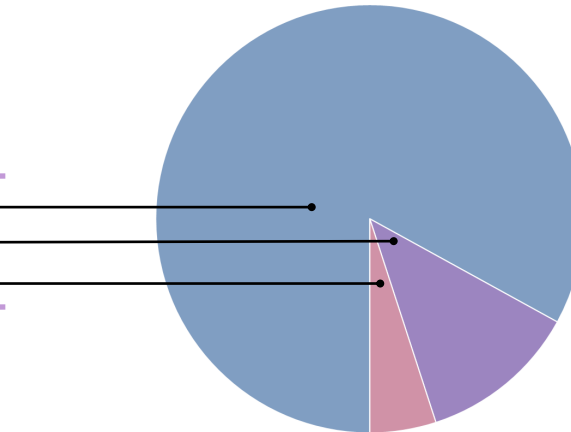

The generosity of funders and fiscally responsible management allowed PeaceWorks to end 2018 with a net positive balance of \$10K. Grants, donations, and fundraising revenue increased approximately \$26k between 2017 and 2018. As the number of clients served each year continues to grow, so do our expenses. We appreciate all that each of you do to help us reach our goals of serving victims of family violence. The family successes that we witness on a day to day basis are proof that this service benefits many.
