2017 Letter From the Executive Director

Dear Friends,

Thank you for helping make 2017 a remarkable year for the Mountain Peace Shelter (MPS). Your donations, volunteer activities, support for our programs and financial gifts made a huge impact on the lives of survivors, their children and pets.



2017 marked 31 years of service to our community. Our dedicated staff has done an incredible job at expanding our outreach while strengthening our programs and services.

In 2017, the organization had a 42% increase in shelter nights, 47% increase in individuals sheltered, a 69% increase in sheltered pets and a 41% increase in crisis calls from 2016. There is great value in the services provided by MPS allowing survivors a safe confidential place to receive support, hope and healing.

A few program highlights of 2017 include ●We provided teen dating violence awareness and education to over 500 youth and provided over 20 presentations to the community regarding Intimate Partner Violence. ●Partnered with the Mountain Resource Center and Park Alliance for Young Children to bring Cooking Matters into MPS. ●Our amazing community donated 9 months of shelter supplies from our top “10 Most Wanted,” list. ●Our volunteers logged over 11,145 hours of service to the organization.

In 2018, PeaceWorks plans to increase public awareness on intimate partner violence, set a norm for healthy relationships within the teen community and widen our collaboration within the community and state. Collaboration is at the core of the work we do, thank you to all our partners who have assisted MPS in saving and improving the lives of some of the most vulnerable populations.

Thank you wholeheartedly for being a part of MPS and supporting us in our fight against Intimate Partner Violence. I am grateful for the hundreds of donors and volunteers passionate about ending DV/IPV and making a difference in the lives of survivors and I am grateful for our team of experienced professionals who help survivors find their voice.

2017 for PeaceWorks/Mountain Peace Shelter was a year of change and growth. We finished the year with financial stability. Additional grants, fundraisers, donations and Colorado Gives Day all contributed to a brighter financial future. Our three year strategic plan includes the Mother Daughter Tea in May and the return of the Taste of Italy in September.

The Mountain Peace Shelter now provides an onsite shelter advocate six days per week. A 42% increase in resident shelter nights in 2017 compared to 2016 is an example of the dedication from volunteers, staff and the board of directors.

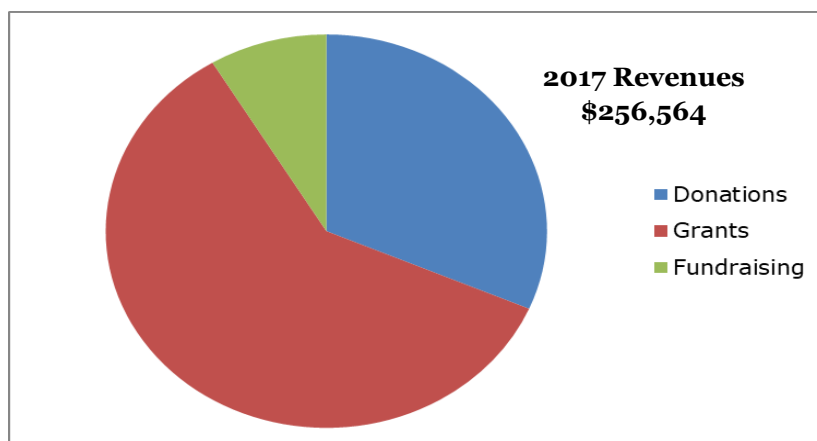

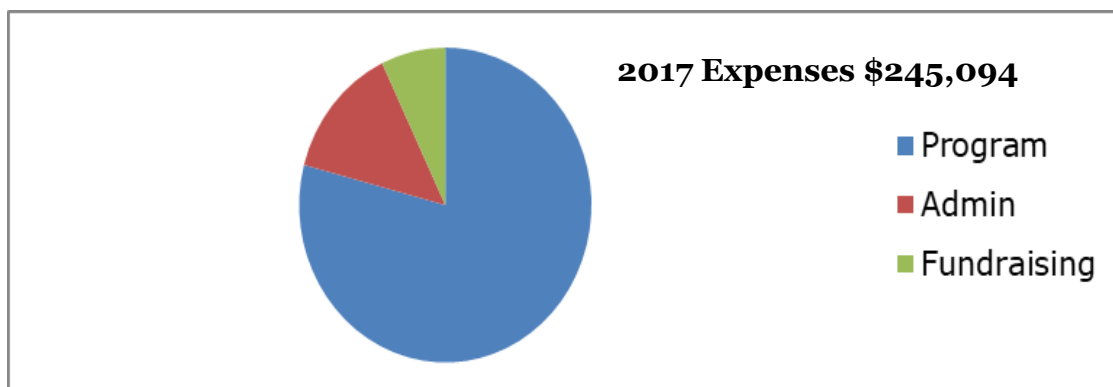
