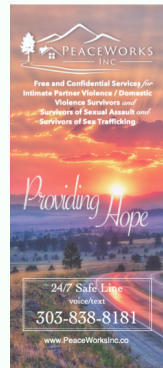

# JOINT LETTER FROM BOARD PRESIDENT AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

2020 was certainly a challenging year for everyone, PeaceWorks, Inc. included. However, PeaceWorks managed to triumph through the challenges! The pandemic forced us to change procedures within the shelter, including a reduction in the number of clients we were able to shelter, as well as how our advocates offer their assistance to clients. Services are 100% in-person now, with the option for virtual offerings. We have COVID to thank for that!

Sadly, throughout 2020, COVID halted many traditional fundraising possibilities, including Taste of Italy, a highly anticipated annual within event our community. We are excited to get back to our traditional fundraising and outreach events while continuing to look for “out of the box” avenues to raise funds. Excitingly, 2020 included an online art show showcasing survivors’ stories on a personal level.

Yet even with these challenges, PeaceWorks has accomplished so much, and with your help, expect to continue to do so in the coming years. Some of the highlights of 2020:

- The shelter received a new roof and other updates including new outdoor furniture, locks and security system, thermostats, and dishwasher.
- The hiring of a maintenance man to help with all the needs of a house approaching 75 years of age!
- Revamping our social media and digital presence, including a new website, logo, email addresses and brochures, including a healthy relationship guide for teens (let us know if you need anything.)
- The Peace & Wellness program, an integrated wellness program promoting both good behavioral health and good self-care practices was implemented at the cusp of the COVID shutdown, and managed to flourish even with initial virtual offerings.
- The addition of a new awareness program, the Resource & Wellness Line, providing all mountain residents with a centralized resource for needs relating to a myriad of things, including assistance with COVID, pets, housing, child care, and more.

Our volunteers continue to be devoted to our cause, without whom we could not do what we do. In 2020, we saw a record breaking amount of individual and community financial donations, and we had an outpouring of volunteers providing us with 9,965 hours of service. This financial and in-kind generosity from the community truly warmed our hearts. This support helped us move forward during this time and helped PeaceWorks assist clients during their journey, by directly supporting our 24/7 Safe Line, virtual fundraising efforts, and assistance around the shelter (clean up, organization, and mask making for clients and staff in shelter).

We anticipate the coming year will offer all a refreshing balance of hope and good fortune. PeaceWorks is thankful for all that we have and for all of you. PeaceWorks re-affirms our commitment to our community, and to our ability to provide excellent and timely services to survivors of intimate partner violence, sexual assault, sex trafficking, stalking, and dating violence. We thank you for your dedication and support, particularly through these times in which many are in great need. Thank you!
